Nevada Law Firms:

Effective January 1, 2018 the Nevada Board of Continuing Legal Education (CLE Board), Reno, NV is transitioning to a new business model which will shift the fees associated with continuing legal education seminars to providers. In addition, the CLE Board is transitioning to electronic, paperless communication with a user-friendly website, nvcleboard.org.

Below, please find the per course fee schedule for attorneys and providers.

	*Fee exempt entities are determined by the CLE Board business plan and outlined in the Supreme Court Order in ADKT 0499. The entities which are exempt from the per credit, per attorney fee are limited to state, county and local bar associations so long as one of these conditions are met; the CLE directly benefits Nevada pro bono provider(s) or the seminar is no more than 1.5 hours and the fee charged is no greater than \$75.

Nevada law firms can apply to become an **Accredited Provider** with the Nevada Board of Continuing Legal Education by obtaining and completing Form 1 – Application for Accredited Sponsorship. The form is located on the board's website here: <https://www.nvcleboard.org/formsinformation.asp#>

This application requires potential providers to include information about their CLE program such as a list of the education activities over the last three calendar years and what the provider is planning for the current year. Applicants commit to a list of representations and agreements should their organization achieve the status of Accredited Provider. Some of the responsibilities of Accredited Providers include notifying the Board in writing of CLE seminars at least 30 days in advance; applying for individual seminar approval for programs where there is a co-sponsor which is not accredited; and allowing the Board to monitor education activities.
